

MD Sustainable Growth Commission **Origins**


- Created in 2010 by statute, as a transition from an initial "Task Force"
- 36 members are diverse stakeholders including environmental, rural, agricultural, industry, local government, and regional representatives, as well as state agencies and members of the **General Assembly**
- Commission members serve 5-year terms





Task Force on the Future for Growth and Development in Maryland 2008-2010

- Held 9 Listening Sessions statewide
- Report's recommendations were instrumental in Smart, Green & Growing legislative proposals for 2009 and 2010 which became law
- Task Force and 4 workgroups continued through 2010





Task Force on the Future for Growth and Development in Maryland Recommendations on Legislation 2009

- Sustainable Growth Act of 2009 (SB 280/HB 297) clarified the link between local comprehensive plans and local land use ordinances.
- Smart Growth Goals, Measures, and Indicators and Implementation of Planning Visions (SB 276/HB 295) required local planning commissions/boards to submit annual reports

to include information on local land use indicators


The Planning Visions (SB 273/HB 294) replaced the State's eight existing planning visions with 12 new visions.

Task Force on the Future for Growth and Development in Maryland Recommendations on Legislation 2010



The Commission shall:


- Advise on <u>achieving 12 Planning Visions</u>

- Promote <u>planning coordination</u> and cooperation
- 4) Advise on the <u>State</u> development, transportation and housing <u>plans</u>



Sustainable Growth Commission Statutory Charge

The Commission shall:


- 5) Promote efficient and predictable <u>State and local development regulations</u>
- 6) Evaluate the effectiveness of the State and local <u>smart growth indicators</u>
- 7) Review local jurisdictions' adequate public facilities development restrictions

The Commission shall:

- 8) Develop <u>educational and outreach programs</u>
- 9) Evaluate the <u>educational requirements</u> for local planning commissions
- 10) Recommend <u>changes</u> in State laws to achieve the State's 12 Planning Visions
- 11)Advise the <u>Governor's Smart</u> <u>Growth Subcabinet</u>




