



OLDER ADULTS BEAR THE BRUNT

Louisiana: Hurricane Katrina (2005), 70% of people who died were over 65

California: Camp Fire (2018) 85% were over 60

North Carolina: Hurricane Florence (2018) 2/3 were over 60


Oregon (2021): heat waves **median age** of people who died was 67

Texas: Winter Storm Uri (2021) 2/3 were over 60

Florida: Hurricane Ian (2022) 2/3 were over 60

Hawai'i: Lahaina wildfires (2023) 73% were over 60

Over 20 years: no change



AGING

Nearly Half of Tar Heels Killed by Hurricane Florence Were 70 or Older

Hurricane Florence was especially lethal for older North Carolinians who made up two-thirds of the people who died during and because of the storm.

NAPLES, Fla. — Rose Marie Santangelo had hurricanes in her decades living near the wat Fla. She thought she was prepared for Hurric

But like so many other Floridians, Ms. Santar aunt who had retired from a career in radiatio underestimated this storm.

"She really thought that it wouldn't hit here," iniece, said. "And then when it did take a turn, was going to be bad."

Ian caused more deaths in Florida — at least its threat. hurricane in almost 90 years. Five other people area none a storm in North Carolina, as well as one in Virginia, Like Ms.

But the storm's impact, while broadly felt, was not even.

Most of the victims were older adults. Two-thirds of them were 60 or older, and 30 were past their 80th birthdays.

The people who died were concentrated in exposed coastal areas and on barrier islands. Though deaths were reported in 21 counties, nearly half came from Lee County, in southwest Florida.

And a large number of victims — at least 58 — drowned, as Ian's <u>size, relatively slow movement</u> and massive storm surge multiplied its threat.

Hawaii Many of first victims identified in Hawaii fires are over the age of 70

While full list probably represent broader cross section of ages, deaths underscore risk for elderly people in fast-moving blazes



WHAT CAN WE DO ABOUT IT?



1. Acknowledge that **climate change impacts older adults differently** – and not just during disasters

2. Recognize that **individual and institutional preparedness is not enough**

3. Lean into solutions that **build community resilience** for all ages.

TAKEAWAY #1: CLIMATE CHANGE IMPACTS OLDER ADULTS DIFFERENTLY DISASTERS OUR "NEW NORMAL"



FOR OLDER ADULTS, DISASTERS MEAN:

- Financial impacts
 from loss or damage
 to property
- Health impacts from interrupted care, persistent damage to homes, and/or evacuation



FOR OLDER ADULTS, OUR 'NEW NORMAL' MEANS:

 Health impacts more intense for those with pre-existing health conditions, and those who live alone
