
Water: In-Line Hydroelectric Turbine

- Completed in 2012
- Raw water pumped over ridge of Big Savage Mtn.
- Turbine installed 350' below peak before Water Treatment Plant
- Net metered (required change in state law)
- Generates about 18% of total electricity consumed by City government each year



Sewer: 20 years of CSO Separation

- Compliance with Consent Order
- Over \$20 M in projects to date – 85% grant funds
- New stormwater system + new sewer + new water + new streets and sidewalks
- Environmental goals
- Infrastructure upgrades

Lighting upgrades to LED

- All street lights have been converted to LED
- Maryland Smart Energy Community Grant used for many retrofit projects
- 1st generation LED lights replaced with new LED this year (ARPA)
- Potomac Edison also retrofitting utility-owned lights



Accessibility

- Sidewalk Retrofit Projects: MDOT Main Street, Safe Routes to School
- Special MDOT Project Sidewalk and Bike Lane on Braddock Road
- Other Bike and Ped studies and plans have been completed \$ needed
- Accessible fishing pier to be constructed at Piney Dam 23/24
- Frostburg Municipal Center \$3.2 M project, completed in 2021 combined 2 antiquated offices into on ADA accessible, modern, efficient office for Police and City Hall





Housing Challenges and Opportunities

- Regional lack of professional, middle-income housing
- Surplus of former student rentals (originally single-family homes)
- 2 new subdivisions
