





\* In constant 2010 dollars





# Poverty Rate – All Individuals





# Poverty Rate – Children



# Poverty Rate – Ages 65+







# Labor Force Participation Rates





# Unemployment Rates





# Unemployment Rates - Maryland



# Unemployment Rates - US







# Pct Bachelor's Degree or Higher



# Pct Graduate or Prof. Degree






# Median Value Owner Occupied\*




# Median Monthly Owner Costs\*


# Pct With Monthly Owner Costs Exceeding 35% of Income \*





# How has Maryland & the U.S. Been Affected by the Great Recession?

- Lower income
- Higher poverty (especially for children)
- Lower labor force participation
- Higher unemployment (especially for men)
- More educated
- Lower home ownership
- Lower housing value from peak, but higher than 2000
- Higher Costs
- Homeowners & renters increasingly cost burdened
- Longer commuting times
