

Voluntary and Forced Migration


Redlining & Racial Covenants

Federal policy to guide banks and determine where to invest, established in 1934 by FHA

Color coded maps

Tracking Blacks, Jews and Immigrants

Restricting who to sell homes to by race and ethnicity




Value Neutral?

- Urban Renewal: Blight, Highways, Railroads
- Exclusionary Zoning



State of Housing

- •Residential segregation
- •Homeownership rates almost twice as high for white than Black Americans
- •A widening wealth gap where the median net worth of a white household is nearly eight times that of a Black household
- •The real estate industry itself where only 2% of development companies are Black-led
- •Inequity for minority-led real estate firms they control only 1.5% of real estate assets that are under management



ADU Policy Challenges

Who will be able to afford to build ADUs? Without assistance, this may be a program for those who already have access to capital.

Complicated bureaucratic processes can exclude folks – anything requiring a lawyer to navigate adds costs

Will ADUs for POCs add value or subtract value?
