
Design Illustration 14






The OODA Loop with Planning









Concept or Sketch Plan



- Consistency with Comprehensive Plan
- Consistency with Zoning/Subdivision Regulations
- Density/Intensity
- General Road/Pedestrian Layout
- Amount of Open Space
- Relationship to Adjacent Development

Preliminary Plan




- More Detailed Information
- Field Run Topography
- Existing and Proposed Utilities
- Stormwater Management Facilities (ESD to the MEP)
- Road/Sidewalk Widths
- Sensitive Areas – Field Delineated Wetlands, Slopes, etc.
- Basis for Engineering Plans

Engineering Plans

- Roads/Storm Drains
- Utilities – Water and Sewer
- Open Space Improvements
- Landscape Plans
- Stormwater Management
- Erosion and Sediment Control
- Off-Site Improvements

Final Plan



- Engineering Complete or Nearly Complete
 - Record of Subdivision
 - Lot Dimensions
 - Rights-of-Way, Easements
 - Survey Monuments

Public Works Agreement(s)

- Executed with Elected Officials
- Guarantee of Public Improvements
- Financial Surety
- Water and Sewer Allocation
- Other Conditions

Final Approval

- All Conditions Met
- Signature of Planning Commission Chair/Secretary or Planning Staff
- Subdivisions Recorded in Land Records

Construction


- Pre-Construction Meeting
- Inspections
- Acceptance of Improvements
- Dedication
