



Background:

- Initiated and developed by Howard County's Department of Planning and Zoning (DPZ) the summer of 2017, with the first class offered that fall
- Taught by professional planners and attorneys
- Offered two to three times per year
- Completed seven classes and engaged over 100 residents, including five elected officials, two Planning Board members, 17 Homeowners Association members, and 13 board or committee members since 2017.

Who: Residents interested in Howard County's planning and who:

- live in various geographic areas of the county;
- represent the county's diverse population;
- have lived in the county for varying amounts of time; and
- are interested in their community's future.

What: The goal of the Academy is for residents to:

- Educate citizens about the land development process, including how growth policies are shaped, the role of *PlanHoward2030*, the development review process, and zoning regulations;
- Teach residents how to access DPZ's interactive map and web-based tools;
- Provide citizens with the tools to participate in the planning process;
- Develop relationships with planning staff; and
- Build a cadre of informed citizens who can become planning ambassadors in their communities.
