# Resource Appendix Template: Implementing Integrated Planning Principles

#### Overview

This appendix serves as a curated list of implementation resources for the Maryland's Sustainable Growth Implementation Guide. It is structured to help a diverse group of users find the specific tools, policies, and funding necessary to translate the Sustainable Growth Principles into action. Resources are organized by the *type of action* the user needs to take (e.g., Policy, Implementation, Data, or Funding), and each entry is tagged with **Primary** and **Secondary** principles to highlight the overlap of impact when implementing each Sustainable Growth Principle.

#### **Section 1: Policy and Legislative Tools**

This section focuses on resources that offer model language for comprehensive plans, zoning ordinances, and regulatory amendments necessary to achieve the state's sustainable growth goals. These tools are designed to move beyond traditional, single-issue regulations by demonstrating how integrated policy can simultaneously address development patterns, environmental protection, and economic vitality. Resources here help legislative staff and elected officials create policy and regulation that enables more sustainable land-use practices.
