**At least once every ten (10) years, each planning commission shall review the comprehensive plan and, if necessary, revise or amend the comprehensive plan, pursuant to Section 1-416 of the Land Use Article . Additionally, to the extent practicable, this schedule includes a flexible range in years to allow a local jurisdiction to access certain U.S. Census data at the beginning of the comprehensive plan review process. In general, this schedule provides commencement of the plan review process one year prior, and two years after, the ten-year adoption anniversary.

During the 2025 session, the Maryland General Assembly adopted [SB 266](#), which replaces the Visions with the 8 Sustainable Growth Planning Principles but maintains the requirement for the Principles to be implemented in comprehensive plans. This change is effective October 1, 2025. An () will appear in this column if the comprehensive plan has not incorporated the principles. When the principles adopted, the year will be displayed in this column. 1 Gaithersburg amends their plan elements on a recurring and rotating schedule.
