Approval of January 11, 2023 Minutes, Updates and Announcements

The January 11, 2023 meeting minutes were approved.

Staff announced that the Town of Eagle Harbor Funding Forum, an initiative of the PRC federal assistance workgroup, will be held on March 4, 2023.

By special vote between the January and February regular meetings, the Commission voted via email to send letters of support for HB216 – Salt Applicator Certification Program – Establishment, SB225 Environment – Publicly Owned Treatment Works – PFAS Monitoring, and HB198 Wastewater Treatment Plants – Water Quality Testing and Sewage Overflow and Pipeline Breakage Notification (Environmental Accountability Act of 2023).

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MDE Sewage Spill Database

Arno Laud, MDE presented on MDE's sanitary sewer overflow reporting program. He noted that if a spill occurs between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., calls are received by MDE. Outside of regular business hours, calls are received by the Maryland Department of Emergency Management (MDEM).

MDE maintains the online "Maryland Reported Sewer Overflow Database" that is current through October 2022. They are in the process of developing a sewer overflow reporting tool (SORT) where treatment plant owners/operators can report spills. By regulation, spills must be reported within 24 hours and written notification must be submitted to MDE within 5 days. Internal training on the SORT is ongoing through March 2023 and then will begin to be rolled out to owners and operators. Complete live access is anticipated by 2024. It was also noted that addressing staffing needs across all programs and enforcement are a priority for the new administration.

2023 PRC Annual Action Plan - review/edit draft

Jason Dubow presented the updated draft annual action plan. John Hartline noted that funding for the creation and maintenance of the report card should be a short-term action. Fred Tutman noted that the Patuxent Riverkeeper has grant funding to support river clean ups. The annual action plan could include identifying sites for clean ups.

Other communities could benefit from the Eagle Harbor funding assistance work. There is potential to create a "waiting" short list. For example, the long-term workgroup could identify other communities that are interested in assistance. A new action item was requested to identify climate change impacts to natural and living resources within the Patuxent River watershed; for example, invasive species.

The draft annual action plan will be updated and brought back to the Commission to make final comments. It is anticipated that the annual action plan will be approved at the first televised meeting of the PRC, possibly in May.

2023 General Assembly – Bills of Interest

Dan Rosen provided an update on pending legislation of interest to the Commission. Staff will check hearing schedules and provide information to John Hartline to determine if there is time to distribute pending legislation to the Commission for comment and official testimony submission to the legislature prior to scheduled bill hearings.

Open Floor

The Commission revisited the opportunity to televise one or two meetings a year. Fred Tutman offered to investigate the feasibility and he will follow up with Mike Leszcz and Tiffany Wright regarding the availability of facilities at the City of Laurel and the City of Bowie, respectively.

Chris Perry noted that the Commission hasn't held a recent field trip and offered to provide a tour of the Magruder's Ferry Landing living shoreline project. John Hartline noted that the Southern Maryland National Heritage Area Act was passed by Congress and was signed into law by President Biden.
