

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## Description of the Data

### Data Contained in this Publication.

This publication contains survey information from the 2005-2009 American Community Survey for social, economic and housing characteristics for Maryland's legislative districts. These are the legislative districts that went into effect in 2002 (pictured on the last page of this publication), and which will be redrawn following the release of 2010 redistricting data. ### What is the American Community Survey (ACS)? What are Five-Year Estimates?

The American Community Survey (ACS) is a nationwide survey designed to collect demographic, social, economic, and housing data every year. The U.S. Census Bureau releases data from the ACS in the form of both single-year and multiyear estimates. Unlike previous Census Bureau data products, the ACS is not concerned with creating population counts, but with collecting data on population characteristics. In the past, population characteristics were collected every ten years through the "long form" of the decennial Census, which was sent to a sample of the total population (approximately one in six households in 2000). The ACS replaces this form with a program that samples 250,000 unique households per month, or 3 million per year, though by the end of five years the ACS will still have a smaller sample size than the decennial Census.

This rolling sample allows population characteristics for large areas (those over 65,000 in population) to be reported yearly, instead of once every ten years under the previous "long form" system. Characteristics for areas containing between 20,000 and 65,000 persons are reported as three-year period estimates, as not enough households are sampled in one year to give reliable estimates. Characteristics for areas containing less than 20,000 persons, again due to their small size, are reported as five-year period estimates. ### What is a Margin of Error (MoE)?

Because the ACS is a sample of a population, its results are subject to error. This error also existed in the previous Decennial Census "long form", but due to the larger sample size it was generally not reported by the Census Bureau. Because of the methodology and the smaller sample sizes used to create the ACS, the reported data may have larger errors than experienced data users are used to seeing. The Census Bureau now reports a margin of error (MoE) based on a 90 percent confidence level that allows data users to understand just how accurate the data is and how it should be used. The estimate minus the MoE represents the lower bound of the estimate, while the estimate plus the MoE represents the upper bound. The interval between the lower and upper bound is the range in which there is a 90 percent chance that the estimate contains that data point's true value. In general, the smaller the MoE relative to the estimate, the more reliable, or the more confidence you can have in the estimate. Generally, three-year average estimates will have a smaller MoE than one-year estimates, and five-year average estimates (such as these) will have the smallest MoE.
