

The 2010-2012 American Community Survey statistics, published November 14th, 2013, are available for the nation, all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, every congressional district, every metro area, and all counties and places with populations of 20,000 or more. Statistics for areas with smaller populations will be available on Dec. 17.


NOTE: The ACS data in this Infographic covers two, three-year periods: 2007 to 2009 and 2010 to 2012. Households are surveyed monthly over each of these 36-month periods and compiled to represent estimates over these two time periods. Data is reported as three-year period estimates for areas of 20,000 or more in population in order to reduce the margins of error associated with these estimates.

* (in constant 2012 dollars)




Maryland and Jurisdiction Median Household Income: 2010-2012

* (in constant 2012 dollars)




Median household income is down in 11 jurisdictions, with the largest declines on the Eastern Shore





Percent of People in Poverty for Maryland's Jurisdictions, 2010-2012




Poverty rates are highest in Baltimore City, on the Eastern Shore and in Western Maryland





Percentage Point Difference in Poverty Rates for Maryland's Jurisdictions, 2007-2009 to 2010-2012




Poverty rates rise the most in Baltimore City, on the Eastern Shore and Western Maryland
