









Means of Transportation to Work in 2021



Percentage of Workers Who Work from Home




Percentage of Workers Who Drive Alone


Percentage of Workers Commuting by Public Transportation


Mean Travel Time to Work





Median Age of Home-Based Workers



Percentage of Home-based Workers by Sex in 2021








Number (in thousands) of Home-based Workers by Occupation





Number (in thousands) of Home-based Workers by Class of Work in Maryland



Number (in thousands) of Home-based Workers by Poverty Status in Maryland





Number (in thousands) of Home-based Workers by Tenure in Maryland







Percentage of Home-based Workers by Community Type in Maryland




