

Self-assessment – Housing Visioning

- 1. Have you developed a vision for housing in your community? If so, what is it? Does it include a vision for affordable housing?
- 2. Have you engaged your stakeholders in a discussion about housing in your community? If so, who are the stakeholders?
- 3. Does your comprehensive plan include a housing element?
- 4. Does your housing vision or comprehensive plan address the provision of workforce housing?
- 4. Have you incorporated housing, one of the 12 visions the Land Use Article requires, into your previous comprehensive plans? How?
- 5. When planning for housing in your jurisdiction, have you considered fair housing laws?
- 6. When considering housing in your community, have you accounted for a regional perspective, including economic, transportation, and labor market impacts? Have you considered how your local housing needs fit into the larger regional housing market?
- 7. Do you have a local department or division dedicated to housing development and needs?
- 8. Have you consulted the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) plans and programs, such as the Consolidated Plan and Single Family/Multi Family residential financing programs?
- 9. Have you researched how neighboring jurisdictions are planning for housing? Have you engaged them in a housing discussion?
- 10. Do your comprehensive plan or other planning documents include goals and objectives for housing? What about housing diversity and housing for all residents?
- 11. Do your comprehensive plan or other planning documents include goals and objectives for affordable, workforce, and low-income housing?
- 12. Does your local housing market enable the development of naturally occurring affordable housing, that which is not subsidized or incentivized (e.g., tax credits)?
- 13. Does your local housing market include subsidized or income restricted housing?
- 14. Have you considered the needs of housing for your population of senior residents?
- 15. Have you considered the needs of housing for your population of persons experiencing homelessness?
- 16. Do you consider housing planning in the context of other planning areas, such as transportation and economic/community development? For example, have you considered opportunities for affordable housing in the context of Transit Oriented Development.
- 17. Have you engaged partners, such as local and regional community development corporations and employers, in a discussion about housing needs in your jurisdiction?
- 18. Have you considered housing needs in your community for both the existing housing stock and future residential development?
