- 7. "Family households" consist of a householder and one or more other people related to the householder by birth, marriage or adoption. It is computed by dividing the total number of vacant units "for rent" by the sum of the renter-occupied units, vacant units that are "for rent", and vacant units that have been rented but not yet occupied; and then multiplying by 100.
