

**SUMMARY REPORT - UNADJUSTED 2010 CENSUS POPULATION COUNTS by EXISTING 2002 Congressional District
(Senate Bill 805, May 6, 2002)**

TOTAL POPULATION by SINGLE RACE ALONE, HISPANIC ORIGIN and VOTING AGE (18+) POPULATION

Note: This section of the report is based on Census 2010 P.L. 94-171 Redistricting Data (Maryland) and is UNADJUSTED for the use of Maryland Redistricting pursuant to the "No Representation Without Population Act" (SB 400\HB 496) signed into Maryland law in 2010. The Maryland census data must be ADJUSTED for purposes of creating congressional, state legislative, and local districting plans. Generally, the law requires that the census data must be adjusted to reassign Maryland residents in State & Federal correctional institutions to their last known address, and to exclude out-of-state residents in correctional institutions from redistricting.
